

## Children- Orders the Court can make

1. **Child Arrangements Order** – introduced in April 2014 to replace residence and contact orders. A Child Arrangements Order decides:-
  - where your child lives
  - when your child spends time with each parent
  - when and what other contact should take place, eg, phone calls, letters
  
2. **Specific Issue Order** – this is used to look at a specific question as to how a child is to be brought up, such as:-
  - which school they should attend
  - whether they should have a religious education
  - changing a child's surname
  
3. **Prohibited Steps Order** – this stops a parent from making a decision about the child's upbringing without the consent of the other parent, such as:-
  - removing a child from England and Wales
  - removing a child from the school they attend
  
4. **Parental Responsibility Order** – to ensure your rights as a parent are recognised by law
  
5. **Relocation Order** – to allow you to move abroad to be with family or to achieve better employment or lifestyle
